

No Sinking Fund is provided for moneys raised by the Commonwealth by the sale of Treasury Bills amounting on 30th June, 1918, to £6,241,031.

Report of the Auditor-General, dated 15th April, 1918, under Section 20 of the Commonwealth Bank Act 1911—

The Statement of Accounts of the Commonwealth Bank for the half-year ended 31st December, 1917, was recently submitted to me for examination by the Governor of the Bank. The inspection of the Bank's books and accounts has been made by Officers acting under my direction and by myself, and this inspection was completed and the aggregate balance-sheet of the Bank certified to by me on 13th instant. As required by the provisions of Section 20 of Commonwealth Bank Act 1911, I have the honour to make the following report upon the result of the audit:—

2. The profit earned by the Bank during the half-year ended 31st December, 1917, was £232,659 1s. 6d. This compared with £226,150 13s. 2d., the profit of the half-year ended 30th June, 1917. The profit made for the half-year under review, therefore, shows an increase upon that of the preceding half-year of £6,508 8s. 4d.

3. Comparing the profit made during the half-year ended 31st December, 1917, namely, £232,659 1s. 6d., with that for the corresponding half-year ended 31st December, 1916, when the profit was £153,072 8s. 2d., the half-year under review shows an increased profit of £79,587 13s. 4d.

4. The General Bank share of the profits for the half-year ended 31st December, 1917, was £195,881 15s. 4d., and that of the Savings Bank, was £36,777 6s. 2d.

5. The total net profit earned by the Bank since its inception to the 31st December, 1917, was £758,951 2s. 4d., of which the General Bank is credited with £718,348 7s. 5d. and the Savings Bank with £40,602 14s. 11d.

6. In accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of the Bank Act, half of the net profits of the Bank has been placed to the credit of the Reserve Fund, and half to the credit of the Redemption Fund, in the Bank's Accounts.

7. The total amount standing to the credit of the Reserve Fund on 31st December, 1917, was £379,475 11s. 2d., and a similar amount, namely, £379,475 11s. 2d., to the credit of the Redemption Fund on that date.

8. The Report for the half-year under review, covering statements showing the position of the Bank's Accounts at the London, Strand, Warminster and Tidworth Branches of the Bank, and which Report was dated 31st January, 1918, was received from Sir William Pender who examines these accounts on my behalf, and the Report reached me on 27th ultimo.

9. The operations of the General Bank Department of the London Branch during the half-year resulted in a profit of £108,848 17s. 7d., but against this profit a reserve for Income Tax, payable to the Imperial Government, was made at the Head Office, Sydney. This reserve amounted to £24,272 18s. 8d., thus reducing the profit shown in the Statement to £84,575 18s. 11d. Against this profit, however, there was a loss on the Savings Bank transactions amounting to £1,080 5s. 2d., thus reducing the net profit of the London Branch to £82,895 13s. 9d.

10. The following Losses occurred upon the operations of the Branches mentioned, due to the operations of the half-year ended 31st December, 1917, namely:—

These losses amounted to £10,076 17s. 11d., thus reducing the net profit on the London and associated Branches to £72,818 15s. 10d.

11. There were no Savings Banks connected with the Tidworth and Warminster Branches. The Strand and Warminster Branches conducted operations for the first time during the half-year.

12. It is interesting to note the progress of the London Branch as exhibited by the number and amount of the private accounts. On the 30th June, 1916, these accounts numbered 493, with a total amount at credit of £26,729 7s. 5d. On the 31st December, 1916, the number was 777, with a credit of £357,734 14s. 6d.; on the 30th June, 1917, the number was 981, the credit being £450,944 3s. 7d.; and on the 31st December, 1917, the total number had increased to 1,075, the amount at credit being £455,503 5s. 4d.

13. The progress of the Commonwealth Bank as a whole from the commencing of operations to the 31st December, 1917, is illustrated by the following table:—

14. The Assets and the corresponding Liabilities of the Bank at the 30th June, 1913, amounted to £5,055,381 9s. 7d. This had increased on the 31st December, 1917, to £47,193,134 7s. 5d.

15. The Officers' Superannuation Fund commenced on 1st January, 1916, with a membership of 516, and had increased to 880 on the 31st December, 1917. The amount to the credit of the Fund on the latter date was £14,111 2s. 1d.

16. The Officers' Fidelity Guarantee Fund at the 31st December, 1917, had a credit balance of £1,119 15s.

17. The accompanying Statements show the Liabilities and Assets of the General Bank apart from the Savings Bank department, and also the Liabilities and Assets of the Savings Bank separately as at the 31st December, 1917. This information cannot be gained from a perusal of the aggregate Balance-sheet presented by the Governor of the Bank. Fuller details than the aggregate Balance-sheet affords are also exhibited.

18. The Bank Premises Asset at Sydney showed the amount of £263,013 8s. 9d. on the 30th June, 1917. During the half-year ended 31st December, 1917, £70,700 was added, making a total of £334,313 8s. 9d. There was, however, £11,442 18s. written off the Main building of the Bank, and £6,500 in connexion with the Post Offices Chambers adjoining the Bank. The total written off, therefore, was £17,942 18s., reducing the Sydney Assets to £316,370 10s. 9d.

19. The Brisbane asset for bank premises remains as before, namely, £24,420.

20. The records exhibiting the advances made at the several branches of the Commonwealth Bank in Australia, and showing the collateral securities deposited in connexion therewith, have been inspected by me, and these appear to evidence great care to secure all advances made to borrowers.

21. The reports received from Sir William Plender upon the London and Associated Branches are at present in action, but they will shortly be forwarded for your perusal, as they contain much interesting information.
