Note.—Until the end of 1905-7 the whole balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was paid to the States. In 1907-8 the whole of the balance was paid to the States after the provision of £193,621 had been made for expenditure in subsequent years under Invalid and Old-age Pensions Trust Account. From 1908-9, and until the abolition of the bookkeeping provisions of the Constitution in 1910-11 the States received only three-fourths of the net Customs and Excise Revenue, and the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was transferred to Invalid and Old-age Pensions, and Naval Defence (Construction of Fleet) Trust Accounts to provide for expenditure in subsequent years. From 1910-11 until the end of 1926-27 the States received twenty-five shillings per head of population per annum. The States Grants Act 1927 abolished the *per capita* payments as from 30th June, 1927, and provided lump sum grants for the year 1927-28, subject to the terms of any agreement made between the Commonwealth and all the States.

A "Financial Agreement," since made between the Commonwealth and the States, and validated by the Commonwealth Parliament under an amendment of the Constitution, provides, *inter alia*, for (a) an annual payment by the Commonwealth from 1st July, 1927, of £7,684,912 towards interest on State Debts, (b) annual sinking fund contributions by the Commonwealth from 1st July, 1927, at the rate of 2s. 6d. for each £100 of Net State Debt existing on 30th June, 1927, and 8s. for each £100 of New Debts created after that date, (c) the Commonwealth to take over State Debts existing on 1st July, 1929, and the States to provide all interest thereon in excess of the annual sum of £7,684,912 provided by the Commonwealth.

From 1910-11 to 1939-40 the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was appropriated for payment of Invalid and Old-age Pensions, War Pensions and other services for which Parliamentary appropriations were available, including reduction of the accumulated deficit.

The Consolidated Revenue Fund for the financial years 1940-41 to 1944-45 was exactly balanced, as all available revenue after charging ordinary services was used for war purposes.

Note.—Penny postage was introduced into Victoria on 1st April, 1901, and was extended to the whole Commonwealth and the British Dominions on 1st May, 1911. On 28th October, 1918, a War Postage Tax of 1d was imposed, but the revenue from this source was not credited to Post Office Revenue. On 2nd October, 1920, the War Postage Tax was discontinued and the ordinary postage increased to 2d. On 1st October, 1923, the ordinary postage was reduced to 1½d, and it was restored to 2d. on 4th August, 1930. From 10th December, 1941, a War Postage Tax of 1d. was imposed in addition to the normal rate of postage on all postal articles except mail matter to and from members of the fighting forces, air mail letters to addressees abroad and parcels.

NATIONAL DEBT SINKING FUND. 1945.

Table No. 50. SUMMARY OF INVESTMENTS IN RAILWAY SINKING FUNDS. The National Debt Sinking Fund was established by the National Debt Sinking Fund Act of 1922-25, and came into operation on 11th August, 1923. By this Act the Loans Sinking Fund, Northern Territory Fund and Port Augusta Railway Sinking Fund were merged into the National Debt Sinking Fund. All moneys standing to the credit of the funds were transferred to, and all investments of these funds made by, the National Debt Sinking Fund.

2. In the uncorrected version, it is stated that "a sum of £1,000,000 was set aside for a period of 30 years commencing on 1st July, 1923, on debt related to the expenditure of the Postmaster-General's Departments out of the Loan Fund from 1st July, 1923, to 30th June, 1953," provided that the contribution in respect of the expenditure of the Postmaster-General's Departments out of the Loan Fund from 1st July, 1923, to 30th June, 1953, was not made from money received as shown under 4 (e), and any year shall not continue for more than 30 years.

Paid into the Fund in accordance with (a) and (b) hereunder, provided that the payments under (a) are payable only for a period of 30 years.

4. (a) Repayment of or advances made out of Loan of Commonwealth Fund, (b) One-half of the sum of the Commonwealth Savings Bank, and of the Commonwealth Fund.

5. (a) Funds received under the Treaty of Peace with Germany.

6. In addition the Treasurer may, under Section 34, pay into the National Debt Sinking Fund each further amount as he may determine.

TABLE No. 60.—NATIONAL WELFARE FUND.

The National Welfare Fund, a trust account under Section 62a of the Audit Act 1901–1934, was established by the National Welfare Fund Act 1943. The Act provides—

- (i) for a payment out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund into the National Welfare Fund each financial year from 1st July, 1943, of a sum of £20,000,000 or a sum equal to one quarter of the amount received in that year as income tax from persons other than companies for Commonwealth purposes, whichever is less;
- (ii) for the application of moneys standing to the credit of the National Welfare Fund in making such payments as are directed by any law of the Commonwealth to be made from the Fund in relation to health services, unemployment or sickness benefits, family allowances, or other welfare or social services;
- (iii) for the crediting to the Fund of interest from the investment of any moneys standing to the credit of the Fund.

Proposed amendments to the Act, as outlined in the Budget for 1945–46, contemplate the following change in the basis of contribution to the Fund as from the 1st July, 1945:—

- (a) a sum equivalent to the total collections in each financial year under the *Social Services Contribution Assessment Act 1945*;
- (b) a sum equivalent to the total collections in each financial year under the *Pay-roll Assessment Act 1941*;
- (c) for the six months ending 31st December, 1945, as the Social Services Contributions Assessment Act will not commence to operate until 1st January, 1946, a further amount of £15,000,000, representing six months equivalent of the annual contribution of £20,000,000 payable under existing legislation.

In addition to the payments previously provided from the Fund, details of which were shown in the corresponding table in the Budget Papers for 1944–45, the amount standing to the credit of the Fund will be applied for the following purposes—

- (a) Invalid and Old-age Pensions.
- (b) Widows Pensions.
- (c) Child Endowment.
- (d) Hospital benefits.
- (e) Tuberculosis benefits.
- (f) Rental rebates under the Housing Agreement.
