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1     **A Bill for an Act to appropriate additional money**  
2     **out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for certain**  
3     **expenditure, and for related purposes**

4     The Parliament of Australia enacts:

5     **Part 1—Preliminary**  
6

7     **1 Short title**

8             This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act (No. 6) 2011-2012*.

1       **2 Commencement**

2                   This Act commences on the day this Act receives the Royal  
3                   Assent.

4       **3 Definitions**

5                   In this Act:

6                   ***administered assets and liabilities item*** means an amount set out in  
7                   Schedule 2 in relation to an Agency opposite the heading  
8                   “Administered Assets and Liabilities”.

9                   ***administered item*** means an amount set out in Schedule 2 opposite  
10                  an outcome for an Agency under the heading “New Administered  
11                  Outcomes”.

12                  ***Agency*** means:

- 13                  (a) an Agency within the meaning of the *Financial Management*  
14                  *and Accountability Act 1997*; or  
15                  (b) the High Court of Australia.

16                  ***CAC Act body*** means:

- 17                  (a) a Commonwealth authority within the meaning of the  
18                  *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*; or  
19                  (b) a Commonwealth company within the meaning of the  
20                  *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*.

21                  ***CAC Act body payment item*** means the amount set out in  
22                  Schedule 2 in relation to a CAC Act body under the heading  
23                  “Non-operating”.

24                  ***Chief Executive*** has the same meaning as in the *Financial*  
25                  *Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

26                  ***current year*** means the financial year ending on 30 June 2012.

27                  ***expenditure*** means payments for expenses, acquiring assets,  
28                  making loans or paying liabilities.

29                  ***Finance Minister*** means the Minister administering this Act.

1 **item** means any of the following:

- 2 (a) a State, ACT, NT and local government item;  
3 (b) an administered item;  
4 (c) an administered assets and liabilities item;  
5 (d) an other departmental item;  
6 (e) a CAC Act body payment item.

7 **other departmental item** means an amount set out in Schedule 2 in  
8 relation to an Agency opposite the heading “Equity Injections”.

9 **Portfolio Additional Estimates Statements** means the Portfolio  
10 Additional Estimates Statements that were tabled in the Senate or  
11 the House of Representatives in relation to the Bill for the  
12 *Appropriation Act (No. 3) 2011-2012* and the Bill for the  
13 *Appropriation Act (No. 4) 2011-2012*.

14 **Portfolio Budget Statements** means the Portfolio Budget  
15 Statements that were tabled in the Senate or the House of  
16 Representatives in relation to the Bill for the *Appropriation Act*  
17 *(No. 1) 2011-2012* and the Bill for the *Appropriation Act (No. 2)*  
18 *2011-2012*.

19 **Portfolio Statements** means:

- 20 (a) the Portfolio Budget Statements; and  
21 (b) the Portfolio Additional Estimates Statements; and  
22 (c) the Portfolio Supplementary Additional Estimates  
23 Statements.

24 **Portfolio Supplementary Additional Estimates Statements** means  
25 the Portfolio Supplementary Additional Estimates Statements that  
26 were tabled in the Senate or the House of Representatives in  
27 relation to the Bill for this Act and the Bill for the *Appropriation*  
28 *Act (No. 5) 2011-2012*.

29 **Special Account** has the same meaning as in the *Financial*  
30 *Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

31 **State, ACT, NT and local government item** means an amount set  
32 out in Schedule 2 opposite an outcome for an Agency under the  
33 heading “Payments to States, ACT, NT and local government”.

1     **4 Portfolio Statements**

2                     The Portfolio Statements are hereby declared to be relevant  
3                     documents for the purposes of section 15AB of the *Acts*  
4                     *Interpretation Act 1901*.

5                     Note:        See paragraph 15AB(2)(g) of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*.

6     **5 Notional payments, receipts etc.**

7                     For the purposes of this Act, notional transactions between  
8                     Agencies are to be treated as if they were real transactions.

9                     Note:        This section applies, for example, to a “payment” between Agencies  
10                     that are both part of the Commonwealth. One of the effects of this  
11                     section is that the payment will be debited from an appropriation for  
12                     the paying Agency, even though no payment is actually made from the  
13                     Consolidated Revenue Fund.  
14

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## Part 2—Appropriation items

### 6 Summary of appropriations

The total of the items specified in Schedule 2 is \$140,531,000.

Note 1: Items in Schedule 2 can be adjusted under Part 3 of this Act.

Note 2: Sections 30 to 32 of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997* also provide for adjustments of amounts appropriated by this Act.

### 7 State, ACT, NT and local government items

- (1) The amount specified in a State, ACT, NT and local government item for an outcome for an Agency may be applied for the purpose of making payments to or for the States, the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory and local government authorities for the purpose of contributing to achieving that outcome.

Note: The Finance Minister manages the expenditure of public money through the issue of drawing rights under the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

- (2) If the Portfolio Statements indicate that activities of a particular kind were intended to be treated as activities in respect of a particular outcome, then expenditure for the purpose of carrying out those activities is taken to be expenditure for the purpose of contributing to achieving the outcome.

### 8 Administered items

- (1) The amount specified in an administered item for an outcome for an Agency may be applied for expenditure for the purpose of contributing to achieving that outcome.

Note: The Finance Minister manages the expenditure of public money through the issue of drawing rights under the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

- (2) If the Portfolio Statements indicate that activities of a particular kind were intended to be treated as activities in respect of a particular outcome, then expenditure for the purpose of carrying

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1 out those activities is taken to be expenditure for the purpose of  
2 contributing to achieving the outcome.

3 **9 Administered assets and liabilities items**

4 (1) The amount specified in an administered assets and liabilities item  
5 for an Agency may be applied for expenditure for the purpose of  
6 contributing to achieving any outcome specified for the Agency:

- 7 (a) in Schedule 2 to this Act; or  
8 (b) in Schedule 1 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 5) 2011-2012*; or  
9 (c) in Schedule 2 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 4) 2011-2012*; or  
10 (d) in Schedule 1 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 3) 2011-2012*; or  
11 (e) in Schedule 2 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2011-2012*; or  
12 (f) in Schedule 1 to the *Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2011-2012*.

13 Note: The Finance Minister manages the expenditure of public money  
14 through the issue of drawing rights under the *Financial Management*  
15 *and Accountability Act 1997*.

16 (2) If the Portfolio Statements indicate that activities of a particular  
17 kind were intended to be treated as activities in respect of a  
18 particular outcome, then expenditure for the purpose of carrying  
19 out those activities is taken to be expenditure for the purpose of  
20 contributing to achieving the outcome.

21 **10 Other departmental items**

22 The amount specified in an other departmental item for an Agency  
23 may be applied for the departmental expenditure of the Agency.

24 Note: The Finance Minister manages the expenditure of public money  
25 through the issue of drawing rights under the *Financial Management*  
26 *and Accountability Act 1997*.

27 **11 CAC Act body payment items**

28 (1) The amount specified in a CAC Act body payment item for a CAC  
29 Act body may be paid to the body to be applied for the purposes of  
30 the body.

31 Note: The Finance Minister manages the expenditure of public money  
32 through the issue of drawing rights under the *Financial Management*  
33 *and Accountability Act 1997*.

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- (2) If:
- (a) an Act provides that a CAC Act body must be paid amounts that are appropriated by the Parliament for the purposes of the body; and
  - (b) Schedule 2 contains a CAC Act body payment item for that body;
- then the body must be paid the full amount specified in the item.

1 **Part 3—Adjusting appropriation items**  
2

3 **12 Reducing State, ACT, NT and local government items and**  
4 **administered items**

5 (1) If:

- 6 (a) an annual report for an Agency for the current year is tabled  
7 in the Parliament; and  
8 (b) the report specifies the amount required by an Agency in  
9 respect of:  
10 (i) a State, ACT, NT and local government item for the  
11 Agency; or  
12 (ii) an administered item for the Agency; and  
13 (c) the required amount is less than the amount of the item;  
14 the item is taken to be reduced to the required amount.

15 (2) The Finance Minister may, by writing:

- 16 (a) determine that subsection (1):  
17 (i) does not apply in relation to the item; or  
18 (ii) applies as if the amount specified in the annual report  
19 were the amount specified in the determination; or  
20 (b) if the report does not specify the required amount—  
21 determine an amount that is taken to be the required amount  
22 for the purposes of subsection (1).

23 (3) A determination made under subsection (2) is a legislative  
24 instrument and, despite subsection 44(2) of the *Legislative*  
25 *Instruments Act 2003*, section 42 (disallowance) of that Act applies  
26 to the determination. However, Part 6 (sunsetting) of that Act does  
27 not apply to the determination.

28 **13 Reducing administered assets and liabilities items and other**  
29 **departmental items**

30 (1) A written request to reduce an administered assets and liabilities  
31 item or an other departmental item for an Agency may be made to  
32 the Finance Minister by:

- 
- 1 (a) the Prime Minister or a Minister acting on behalf of the  
2 Prime Minister; or  
3 (b) the Minister who is responsible for the Agency; or  
4 (c) if the Finance Minister is responsible for the Agency—the  
5 Chief Executive of the Agency.
- 6 (2) If a request is made under subsection (1), the Finance Minister  
7 may, by writing, determine that the item is to be reduced by the  
8 amount specified in the request.
- 9 (3) However, the determination has no effect to the extent that it would  
10 reduce the item below nil, after subtracting amounts that have been  
11 applied under Part 2 in respect of the item.
- 12 (4) The item is taken to be reduced in accordance with the  
13 determination.
- 14 (5) Despite subsection 33(3) of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*, the  
15 determination must not be rescinded, revoked, amended or varied.
- 16 (6) A request made under subsection (1) is not a legislative instrument.
- 17 (7) A determination made under subsection (2) is a legislative  
18 instrument and, despite subsection 44(2) of the *Legislative  
19 Instruments Act 2003*, section 42 (disallowance) of that Act applies  
20 to the determination. However, Part 6 (sunsetting) of that Act does  
21 not apply to the determination.

## 22 **14 Reducing CAC Act body payment items**

- 23 (1) A written request to reduce a CAC Act body payment item for a  
24 CAC Act body may be made to the Finance Minister by:  
25 (a) the Prime Minister or a Minister acting on behalf of the  
26 Prime Minister; or  
27 (b) the Minister who is responsible for the body; or  
28 (c) if the Finance Minister is responsible for the body—the  
29 Secretary of the Department.
- 30 Note: For *Department*, see subsection 19A(3) of the *Acts Interpretation Act*  
31 *1901*.

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- 1 (2) If a request is made under subsection (1), the Finance Minister  
2 may, by writing, determine that the item is to be reduced by the  
3 amount specified in the request.
- 4 (3) However, the determination has no effect to the extent that it would  
5 reduce the item below nil, after subtracting amounts that have been  
6 paid to the body in respect of the item.
- 7 (4) The item is taken to be reduced in accordance with the  
8 determination.
- 9 (5) Despite subsection 33(3) of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*, the  
10 determination must not be rescinded, revoked, amended or varied.
- 11 (6) Subsection 11(2) does not limit the reduction of a CAC Act body  
12 payment item under this section.
- 13 (7) A request made under subsection (1) is not a legislative instrument.
- 14 (8) A determination made under subsection (2) is a legislative  
15 instrument and, despite subsection 44(2) of the *Legislative*  
16 *Instruments Act 2003*, section 42 (disallowance) of that Act applies  
17 to the determination. However, Part 6 (sunsetting) of that Act does  
18 not apply to the determination.

19 **15 Advance to the Finance Minister**

- 20 (1) If the Finance Minister determined an amount under subsection  
21 15(2) of the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2011-2012* before the  
22 commencement of this Act, the amount is to be disregarded for the  
23 purposes of subsection 15(3) of that Act.

24 Note: This means that, after the commencement of this Act, the Finance  
25 Minister has access to \$380 million under section 15 of the  
26 *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2011-2012*, regardless of amounts that have  
27 already been determined under that section.

- 28 (2) If:  
29 (a) this Act appropriates an amount for particular expenditure;  
30 and  
31 (b) before the commencement of this Act, the Finance Minister  
32 determines an amount (the ***advanced amount***) under

1                            section 15 of the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2011-2012* for the  
2                            expenditure;  
3                            the amount appropriated by this Act for the expenditure is taken to  
4                            be reduced (but not below nil) by the advanced amount.  
5

1 **Part 4—General drawing rights limits**  
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3 **16 General drawing rights limits**

4 *Building Australia Fund*

5 On and after the commencement of this Act, subsection 16(1) of  
6 the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2011-2012* has effect as if the  
7 general drawing rights limit specified in that subsection were  
8 \$2,236,700,000.

9 Note: This increases the Building Australia Fund general drawing rights  
10 limit for the current year by \$11,000,000.  
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**Part 5—Miscellaneous****17 Crediting amounts to Special Accounts**

If any of the purposes of a Special Account is a purpose that is covered by an item (whether or not the item expressly refers to the Special Account), then amounts may be debited against the appropriation for that item and credited to that Special Account.

**18 Conditions etc. applying to State, ACT, NT and local government items**

- (1) This section applies to any payment made out of money appropriated by a State, ACT, NT and local government item for an outcome specified in column 2 of the table in Schedule 1.
- (2) The payment:
  - (a) must be made on the terms and conditions (if any) from time to time determined, in the way described in subsection (3), as applying to payments made:
    - (i) in relation to the outcome; and
    - (ii) to or for a State, the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory or a local government authority; and
    - (iii) out of money appropriated by an annual Appropriation Act; and
  - (b) must be made in accordance with any determination in writing made by the Minister specified, in column 4 of the table in Schedule 1, for the outcome as to amounts and times of payments.
- (3) The way of determining the terms and conditions applying to payments described in paragraph (2)(a) is for the Minister specified, in column 3 of the table in Schedule 1, for the outcome to make the determination in writing before or after the commencement of this Act.
- (4) Determinations mentioned in paragraph (2)(a) and determinations made under paragraph (2)(b) are not legislative instruments.

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- 1                   (5) This section does not limit the Commonwealth's power to:  
2                   (a) apply terms and conditions to payments made out of money  
3                   that is not appropriated by a State, ACT, NT and local  
4                   government item; or  
5                   (b) determine the amounts and times of those payments.

6                   **19 Appropriation of the Consolidated Revenue Fund**

7                   The Consolidated Revenue Fund is appropriated as necessary for  
8                   the purposes of this Act, including the operation of this Act as  
9                   affected by the *Financial Management and Accountability Act*  
10                  1997.
